APPROVING AND ADOPTING AMENDMENTS TO THE GENERAL MOBILITY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE FISCAL YEARS 1994 THROUGH 2003; AND MAKING FINDINGS AND PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO THE SUBJECT.

WHEREAS, in September 1993 the Board of Directors adopted an updated General Mobility Capital Improvement Program for fiscal years 1994 through 2003; and

WHEREAS, since that time greater definition in projects has been achieved through receipt of actual construction bids, some projects have been deferred and other projects advanced by METRO's funding partners, and enhancements to the General Mobility Capital Improvement Program have been identified which can be accommodated within the funding available; and

WHEREAS, in view of these changes the Board of Directors is of the opinion that it is reasonable and proper to amend the General Mobility Capital Improvement Program to recognize the changes which have occurred in proposed projects;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY THAT:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves and adopts an amended General Mobility Capital Improvement Program for fiscal years 1994 through 2003 by incorporating the changes and additions contained in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 2. The General Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed to take such actions as are reasonable and necessary to carry out the amended General Mobility Capital Improvement Program.

PROJECT:

Auden and Edloe streets from Bellaire Boulevard to University Boulevard.

IMPROVEMENT:

Both Auden and Edloe will be upgraded from existing two-lane asphalt roadways with curb and gutters to two-lane concrete streets with curb and gutters. Each road is about 0.60 miles in length. Other project improvements will include necessary adjustments to utilities and sidewalks within the street rights-of-way.

BENEFITS:

The replacement of the existing asphalt roadways with concrete pavement will improve traffic flow and circulation on these two major arterial streets within the city of Southside Place for many years.

FUNDING:

The estimated project cost is \$1.0 million. METRO's participation will be 50% of the total project costs not-to-exceed \$500,000. The city of Southside Place will be the managing party with METRO's financial participation scheduled for FY97.

PROJECT:

Resurfacing of Blalock Forest from Blalock Road to its termination.

IMPROVEMENT:

Reconstruct existing flexible base, asphaltic surface curb and gutter system by rebuilding or replacing existing base and curb and gutters and replacing the asphaltic surface.

BENEFITS:

Reconstruction of this deteriorated street will benefit the local traffic.

FUNDING:

METRO will contribute \$250,000 towards the construction cost of this project in FY95.

PROJECT:

Blalock Road from Taylorcrest Road to Memorial Drive.

IMPROVEMENT:

Reconstruct and repave an existing two lane flexible base asphalt surface roadway with open ditches.

BENEFITS:

Reconstructing and repaving Blalock will benefit the local area residents using this collector street as well as other motorists travelling through the villages.

FUNDING:

METRO will contribute \$130,000 in FY95 towards the reconstruction of Blalock.

PROJECT:

Bridge on Brogden Road over HCFCD unit 140-01-01 (Hunter's Creek).

IMPROVEMENT:

Replacement of existing wood timber structure bridge with a new concrete structure bridge. The existing timber bridge has been inspected by a consulting engineer and found to be in poor condition.

BENEFITS:

Replacement with a new safe structure will benefit area residents using Brogden Road to travel to the commercial development bordering IH-10 and school children which take the Brogden Road route by way of riding school buses to nearby schools.

FUNDING:

METRO will contribute \$350,000 in FY95, the estimated construction cost to replace the new bridge.

PROJECT:

Hike and Bike Trail on Claymore Road from Hedwig Road to Piney Point Road.

IMPROVEMENT:

Construction of a concrete hike and bike trail on the north side of Claymore Road.

BENEFITS:

The hike and bike trail will facilitate pedestrian and bicycle movement and add to the safety of school children going to two schools located on Claymore Road.

FUNDING:

METRO will contribute \$104,000 in FY95 towards the construction of this hike and bike trail.

PROJECT:

Cravens Road from South Gessner Road to U.S. 90A (Main Street) in Missouri City. Widening from existing two-lane to a four-lane facility. This new project is currently a candidate project with a point ranking of 3 and 200 points.

IMPROVEMENT:

Cravens Road will be reconstructed and widened from an existing two-lane asphalt open ditch roadway to a four-lane concrete boulevard roadway with curbs and gutters from South Gessner Road to U.S. 90A (Main Street) in Missouri City. Project length is approximately 0.82 miles.

BENEFITS:


The widening and upgrading of Cravens Road will provide a connecting roadway between Gessner and Main Street (90 A).

FUNDING:

The estimated project cost is approximately \$3.5 million. METRO's participation will be a maximum \$3.1 million in FY96. METRO may serve as managing agency for the design and construction of the project which is estimated at \$3.1 million. The City of Missouri City would be responsible for assembling donated right-of-way with an estimated value of approximately \$400 thousand.

CRAVENS ROAD

South Gessner Road to U.S. 90A



PROJECT:

Additional funding for the Franz Road from Katy-Hockley Cutoff to Avenue D (J77).

IMPROVEMENT:

Franz Road will be reconstructed and widened from an existing two-lane asphalt section to a four-lane concrete, curb and gutter boulevard section for a length of approximately 1.0 mile.

BENEFITS:

The widening of Franz Road from a two-lane undivided local street to a four-lane divided boulevard section will improve traffic flow and reduce maintenance costs.

FUNDING:

METRO funding for this existing General Mobility project would be increased from \$950,000 to \$1.45 million. METRO funding would provide \$100,000 for right-of-way acquisition in FY95 with the balance of \$1.35 million available for construction in FY97 and FY98. The City of Katy will be the managing partner and the County has committed \$1 million towards this project.

PROJECT:

Piney Point Road from Soldiers Creek to Memorial Drive. Improvement of a two-lane roadway and storm drainage system. This new project is currently on the candidate list with 175 points.

IMPROVEMENT:

Piney Point Road will be upgraded from an existing 22-foot wide roadway with open ditches to City of Houston standards by lowering the roadway and widening the pavement to a 27-foot wide two-lane concrete facility with curbs and gutters. As an adjunct to this project the Harris County Flood Control District has previously proposed the installation of a large box culvert to run adjacent to the Piney Point Road project for approximately one-half its length. This box culvert project would improve the drainage systems of the cities of Piney Point, Bunker Hill, Hedwig Village and Hunters Creek, and surrounding areas of western Houston.

BENEFITS:


The lowering and widening of Piney Point Road will upgrade this roadway to current City of Houston standards for undivided urban roadways. This will allow for safer traffic flows especially relative to traffic to and from Memorial Drive Elementary School, Spring Branch Middle School, and Memorial Senior High School.

FUNDING:

The estimated roadway construction cost is approximately \$3.4 million with METRO participation not to exceed \$3.2 million in FY96. Harris County and the City of Piney Point will be responsible for design and project management.

PINEY POINT ROAD

Soldiers Creek to Memorial Drive



PROJECT:

Bridge on Smithdale over Soldier's Creek.

IMPROVEMENT:

Replacement of existing concrete structure bridge with a new concrete structure bridge. The existing bridge has been inspected by a consulting engineer and found to be failing structurally.

BENEFITS:

Replacement with a new safe structure will benefit area residents using the bridge and school children riding school buses on Smithdale.

FUNDING:

METRO will contribute \$275,000 in FY95 towards the construction cost of the new bridge.

PROJECT:

Spring Valley: Bingle and Campbell (G-130).

IMPROVEMENT:

Reconstruction and widening of Bingle Road from IH-10 to Spring Branch Creek from a two lane asphalt open ditch roadway to a four lane concrete curb and gutter roadway. Reconstruction and widening of Campbell Road from IH-10 to Westview from a two lane asphalt open ditch roadway to a three lane concrete curb and gutter roadway.

BENEFITS:

Reconstruction and widening of these roadways will reduce traffic congestion for motorists traveling in and through the City of Spring Valley.

FUNDING:

METRO is funding and managing this project in the City of Spring Valley. METRO funding would be increased by \$50,000 thousand.

PROJECT:

Additional funding for the currently designated Timber Cove Street Improvements (G81).

IMPROVEMENT:

Rehabilitation of various streets and bridges within the Timber Cove section of Taylor Lake Village.

BENEFITS:

The rehabilitation and repaving of these street and bridge structures will improve local traffic flow and reduce maintenance costs.

FUNDING:

METRO funding for this Taylor Lake Village managed project would be increased by \$315,000 from \$415,000 to \$730,000. The additional funds would be available in FY94.

PROJECT:

Townsen Boulevard extension from U.S. 59 to FM 1960. This project is an extension of the existing Townsen Boulevard project (J86) which is a new four lane roadway. This project is currently a candidate project with 165 points.

IMPROVEMENT:

Townsen Boulevard will be extended westward and then southward from U.S. 59 to FM 1960, approximately 1.5 miles. The roadway will be constructed across mainly undeveloped property. It will consist of a four-lane concrete boulevard roadway with curbs and gutters.

BENEFITS:


The extension of Townsen Boulevard will enhance vehicular mobility in the vicinity of U.S. 59 and FM 1960 and access to METRO's new Townsen Park and Ride Lot. This extension will allow vehicles on U.S. 59, FM 1960, and Loop 184 a more direct route. This project will relieve traffic congestion around the Deerbrook Mall and adjoining commercial development.

FUNDING:

The estimated project cost is approximately \$8.5 million. METRO's participation will be 60% of the construction cost up to a maximum of \$3.6 million in FY97. The City of Humble will fund the remaining 40% of the construction cost. Private donors will provide \$1.0 million dollars in right-of-way donations. Harris County will provide approximately \$1.0 million dollars in engineering design and construction management services.

TOWNSEN BOULEVARD EXTENSION

U.S. 59 to F.M. 1960



PROJECT:

Weslayan Street from University Boulevard to Bissonnet Street (J75, Phase 2).

IMPROVEMENT:

Weslayan Street will be reconstructed from an existing two-lane, asphalt overlaid concrete roadway with curbs and gutters to a two-lane, concrete street with curbs and gutters for a distance of approximately 0.75 miles.

BENEFITS:

The replacement of the existing asphalt with concrete pavement will improve traffic flow and circulation on this major arterial street within the city of West University Place. This section of Weslayan Street (Phase 2) would be an extension of the Weslayan Street project from Bellaire Boulevard to University Boulevard which the METRO Board designated in December, 1993.

FUNDING:

The estimated total project cost is approximately \$850,000. METRO's participation will be 100% of the construction costs, not to exceed \$600,000. The city of West University Place will be the managing party with METRO's financial participation scheduled for FY96.

XIX-2 CONTRACT DISPUTES APPEAL PROCEDURE

- A. All contract disputes shall be submitted to the Contracting Officer initially for a written decision.
- B. If the contractor wishes to appeal the Contracting Officer's decision, it shall submit a written notice of appeal within ten (10) days after receipt of the Contracting Officer's written decision.
- C. Appeal of the Contracting Officer's written decision on a contract dispute may be pursued either through the Disputes Appeal Committee or through non-binding third-party arbitration. The contractor shall elect which appeal process it wishes to include in its contract at the time its bid or proposal is submitted.
- D. Appeals pursued through the Disputes Appeal Committee shall be handled as follows:
 - A Disputes Appeal Committee consisting of at least the following personnel will be designated:
 - A Manager of Contracts not responsible for the procurement.
 - 2. A member of the Office of Staff Counsel.
 - 3. A Manager or professional level staff member.
 - o The Contract Administrator will prepare an indexed and tabbed Disputes Appeal file consisting of:
 - 1. Contractor's initial claim correspondence,

- 2. Contracting Officer's denial letter,
- 3. Relevant correspondence pertaining to the dispute,
- 4. Relevant parts of specifications, statement of work, scope of service, drawings, contract articles or other provisions.
- The Manager of Contracts will notify the individual Disputes Appeal Committee members of their appointment in writing.
- o The Manager of Contracts will set a date for the Disputes

 Appeal Committee hearing mutually acceptable to the

 contractor and METRO.
- o The Manager of Contracts will advise the contractor in writing of the following:
 - The Disputes Committee hearing time, date and location,
 - The hearing will afford the contractor the opportunity to orally present its position to the Committee,
 - 3. The Committee will also consider any written documentation the contractor wishes to present,
 - The contractor may present technical or other representatives in its behalf,
 - 5. The names and positions of the Disputes Committee hearing members.
 - O A written report of the Disputes Appeal Committee

findings and recommendations shall be provided to the General Manager as soon as practicable subsequent to hearing.

- The General Manager's written decision will be conveyed to the contractor as soon as practicable after the decision is signed.
- O In disputes involving federal or size grant funds, the Contracts Manager or Staff Counsel small forward a copy of all necessary documents and the General Manager's decision when requested by FTA or other appropriate grantor agency, or when METRO management staff determines it is advisable to do so.
- E. Appeals pursued through non-binding sitration shall be handled as follows:
 - An arbitrator mutually acceptable to METRO and the contractor shall be selected. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, arbitrators shall be melected through the American Arbitration Association.
 - o Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, the arbitrator shall schedule a hearing within ten (10) days of his/her selection.
 - The hearing shall be informal but wither party has the right to be represented by counselif it so desires.
 - No post hearing brief shall be file or transcripts made.

 Either party may file a written stmement of position at

the time of the hearing.

- o There shall be no formal rules of evidence.
- o The hearing shall normally be completed within one day.
- o The arbitrator shall render a written recommendation within three working days after the conclusion of the hearing. By mutual agreement of the parties, the time for rendering a decision may be extended for an additional two working days.
- The recommendation of the arbitrator shall be based on the record before the arbitrator and should include a brief written explanation of the basis for the recommendation.
- o The written findings of the arbitrator shall be submitted to the General Manager who shall make the final decision on the dispute.
- O Costs of the arbitration shall be shared equally by METRO and the contractor.

AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE GENERAL MANAGER TO NEGOTIATE, EXECUTE AND DELIVER AN AGREEMENT WITH THE TEXAS MEDICAL CENTER FOR PROVISION OF SHUTTLE SERVICE WITHIN THE TEXAS MEDICAL CENTER; AND MAKING FINDINGS AND PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO THE SUBJECT.

WHEREAS, METRO has provided shuttle service since 1986 within the Texas Medical Center under contract with the Texas Medical Center; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Medical Center has expressed interest in continuing to have METRO-provided shuttle service operate within the Texas Medical Center;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY THAT:

Section 1. The General Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate, execute and deliver an agreement with the Texas Medical Center for the continuation of bus shuttle service within the Texas Medical Center.

Section 2. The allocation of costs for the provision of shuttle service within the Texas Medical Center shall be 33% paid by the Texas Medical Center and 67% absorbed by METRO with the total cost of shuttle service not to exceed \$56.78 per revenue hour.

WHEREAS, in order to meet METRO's paratransit fleet and non-revenue vehicle fleet requirements it is necessary to acquire paratransit and non-revenue vehicles for fiscal year 1994 that operate on traditional gasoline or diesel fuel;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY THAT:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby certifies that the acquisition of alternatively fueled paratransit and non-revenue vehicles in fiscal year 1994 is not feasible because of lack of appropriate fueling facilities and the projected cost

measured over the useful life of the equipment or fueling facilities is greater than for continued use of traditional gasoline or diesel fuels.

responsible for ensuring that information sought by Board members is accurate and is provided in a timely fashion.

Section 2. The procedure for Board member requests for information to METRO staff is:

- All requests for staff-provided information shall be made to the General Manager or to appropriate Senior Staff members who report directly to the General Manager, i.e. Deputy General Managers or Assistant General Managers who report directly to the General Manager. If an information request is made to a Deputy General Manager or Assistant General Manager, he or she shall promptly report the request to the General Manager.
- B) The General Manager shall undertake to provide the requested information in a timely fashion. Prior to releasing the requested information, the General Manager shall have it reviewed as appropriate to ensure that it is responsive to the request and accurate.
- C) All staff information prepared in response to a Board member's request shall be provided to all Board members.
- D) Requests requiring significant analysis or research shall be submitted through the Chairman of the Board.

Section 3. This resolution is not intended to supersede or alter previous Board resolutions dealing with the Assistant General Manager for Audit and the Board relationship with the Office of Audit.

SPECIAL EVENT TRANSIT SERVICE POLICY

<u>Definition of Special Event Transit Services</u>

Special Event Transit Services are transit services specifically designed to support community events and activities that are open to the general public. All services are available to the general public at the designated fare for the service.

This policy does not apply to Charter Services. Charter Services are designed to meet the needs of a specific organization and patronage is restricted to those designated by that organization. The Federal Transit Administration has issued regulations that restrict the operation of charters by public transit agencies and require recovery of fully-allocated total costs when charters are operated.

Criteria for operation of Special Event Transit Services

In order for METRO to provide Special Event Transit Services, an event must meet all of the following criteria:

- . The event must be open to and of general interest to the citizens of the METRO service area.
- . The service must originate and terminate in the METRO service area.
- . The event must have anticipated attendance of at least 10,000 persons per day and/or the event must have either limited parking or anticipated related traffic congestion.
- . The event must be reasonably expected to generate sufficient ridership and revenues to cover the percentage of costs as outlined below.
- . Any exceptions to these criteria must be approved by the General Manager.

Fares/cost recovery

Community and special events are recreational/social activities typically sponsored by a public or private entity. METRO is legally prohibited from making charitable contributions to non-profit agencies. Further, METRO does not desire to expend public tax dollars to the benefit of specific for-profit entities.

Therefore, Special Event Transit Services will be priced so that passenger fares and/or sponsor reimbursements (if any) cover 100% of the direct cost of operating the service. METRO will not charge any management allocation, indirect costs, capital costs or traffic management costs to the service for fare/ cost recovery purposes.

Fare discounts will be consistent with METRO fare policy for fixed-route service. The established public fare will be charged to all patrons 12 years of age or older. Children between ages 5 and 11 inclusive, Elderly/Handicapped and Student discount cardholders will be charged one-half the adult fare. Children under 5 and Freedom Passport holders will ride free of charge. METRO employee passes, patron monthly passes, etc. are not honored on Special Event Services.

further, that METRO is unable to acquire or be provided equipment for a fueling facility necessary to operate alternative fuel non-revenue vehicles at a cost that is reasonably expected to result in no greater net cost compared to continued use of traditional gasoline and diesel fuel vehicles. The Board hereby certifies the above findings and declarations as true and correct.

Section 2. The General Manager be and he is hereby authorized to procure those non-revenue vehicles provided for in METRO's fiscal year 1995 budget with traditional gasoline or diesel fueled power plants as appropriate.

ESTABLISHING A REVISED FARE STRUCTURE, DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE REVISED FARE STRUCTURE; AND MAKING FINDINGS AND PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO THE SUBJECT.

WHEREAS, in February of 1985, the Board adopted a fare policy calling for an annual review of METRO's fare structure; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed a proposed revision to the fare structure presented by METRO staff; and

WHEREAS, the Board has considered the comments received at public hearings held on the issue of the proposed fare increases; and

WHEREAS, the Board is of the opinion that a modest fare increase in local, express and commuter fares is warranted while fares for senior citizens, students and METROLift patrons should remain at current levels; and

WHEREAS, the Board is also of the opinion that the quantity fare discounts proposed by METRO staff be adopted;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY THAT:

Section 1. A fare structure as set out in Exhibit I attached hereto is hereby adopted to be effective October 1, 1994.

Section 2. Effective on October 1, 1994, the fares, rates and charges for METRO transit services shall be as set out in Exhibit II attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 3. No further fare adjustments will take effect in fiscal year 1995 and fiscal year 1996.

Section 4. The General Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed to undertake all actions reasonable and necessary to implement the revised fare structure.

Section 5. Except as amended herein, the fare policies and practices established by Resolution 85-18 shall remain in full force and effect.

FARE STRUCTURE

A. <u>Local Fares</u>

- 1. <u>Base Fare</u> The base fare for all local routes shall be set at a flat rate.
- 2. Express Service A premium fare equal to 1.5 times the base fare shall be set for express service routes. Express service is defined as those routes which operate at least six miles on a freeway or a major thoroughfare, and have no more than two stops in that six-mile portion.
- 3. Pass and Ticket-Book Pricing Monthly passes for local and express service shall be priced at 47 (rides) times the base fare, less a 25% discount, rounded down to the nearest 50 cents. Weekly passes for local service shall be priced at slightly more than one-fourth the monthly pass rate. Annual passes for local and express service shall be priced at 12 (months) times the monthly pass price, less a 25% discount. Ten-ride ticket books for express service shall be priced at a 10% discount from cash.
- 4. <u>Token Pricing</u> Ten-token packs for local service shall be priced at a 20% discount from cash. Individual discounts as identified in Section D will not apply to tokens.

B. Commuter Fares

- 1. <u>Base Fare</u> The base fare for commuter service shall be set for premium (point-to-point) service, with a route length of up to ten miles. The commuter base fare will start at twice the local base fare. Patrons who ride express and/or park and ride service midday, evenings, weekends and in the off-peak direction during rush hours pay only the local fare.
- 2. <u>Incremental Fares</u> The fare for commuter routes over ten miles in length shall be set according to the number of successive five-mile intervals over which the route length extends. Each five-mile length (beyond the first ten miles) will add another increment to the commuter base fare. For those commuter routes servicing two major activity centers which are more than five miles apart, two sets of fares may be charged as appropriate to the distances traveled. (See Exhibit II for fare increment pricing.)

- 3. Pass & Ticket Book Pricing Monthly passes for commuter service shall be priced at 42 (rides) times the appropriate base cash fare, less approximately a 25% discount, rounded down to the nearest 50 cents. Annual passes for commuter service shall be priced at 12 (months) times the monthly pass price, less a 25% discount. Forty-ride ticket books shall be priced at a 10% discount from cash, with ten-ride ticket books priced at slightly more than one-fourth of the forty-ride ticketbook price.
- C. <u>Charter Rates</u> METRO shall price its charter bus services so that the Authority shall recover all of its fully-loaded costs from any charter engagement. Charter rates will be reviewed and updated at least annually, as appropriate.
- D. <u>Transfers</u> All transfers from one METRO route to another of equal or lower fare shall be free. METRO drivers shall issue a transfer slip to any passenger upon receipt of cash, ticket or token fare payment. The transfer is valid for local service only unless punched by the driver to reflect additional fare paid. The transfer is punched and issued according to current operating instructions.
- E. <u>Individual Discounts</u> The following general principles apply to discounted fares for patrons who are senior citizens, disabled, students and children. (See Exhibit II for fare increment pricing.)
 - 1. <u>Senior Citizens & Disabled</u> The fare for senior citizens (persons over 62 years of age) presenting a valid identification card shall be approximately 0.5 times the regular fare. Disabled persons presenting a valid identification card plus a Freedom Passport shall ride free on fixed route service. Disabled persons who do not present a Freedom Passport shall pay half fare.
 - 2. <u>Students</u> The fare for junior high and high school students presenting a valid identification card shall be approximately 0.5 times the regular fare.
 - 3. <u>Children</u> Children between the ages of 5 and 11 shall ride for a rate of approximately 0.3 times the regular fare. Children under 5 years of age may ride free when accompanied by a fare-paying passenger.
- F. <u>METROLift Fares</u> The METROLift fare shall be set within the requirements established by the Americans with Disabilities Act governing paratransit as a complement to fixed route service.

G. Distribution Discounts

1. <u>Ticket Outlets</u> - Ticket outlets that sell a minimum of \$500 of METRO fare scrip monthly will be allowed the following discounts:

Ticket Outlets having ten or more separate locations, but having a common delivery to one location, will receive the next higher discount level.

2. <u>RideSponsors</u> - RideSponsors (employers) who, on a monthly basis, purchase 25 passes and/or quantities of ticketbooks equivalent to 25 monthly passes, will be allowed the following discounts:

3. Community Service Agencies - Non-profit community service agencies who purchase at least 250 tokens, or 250 tickets or 5 passes, or 5 ticketbooks monthly will be allowed an additional 10% discount from the price of the ten-token packs and from the face value of passes and tickets. Furthermore, where tokens are purchased in quantities of 25,000 (2,500 10-token packets), an additional 5% discount will be allowed. Payment must be made to METRO at the time the fare media is released.

- NOTE 1: Tokens, purchased in packs of ten, can be used on local routes only. Because they may be purchased and used by any patron, tokens are only available in packs of ten at the ten-ride price. No other discounts apply to tokens.
- NOTE 2: For patrons with a METRO ID, the local service fares for Senior Citizens and Junior and Senior High School Students are as stated above. Other fares for these patrons are shown on Exhibit III.
- NOTE 3: The local fares for 5-11 year old patrons are as stated above. Other fares for these patrons are shown on Exhibit III. Children under the age of 5 ride free.
- NOTE 4: Registered METROLift patrons purchase METROLift tickets in advance. A METROLift fare includes a free ride for a patron's companion, if necessary.
- NOTE 5: When using the Freedom Passport along with the METROLift ID, the fares are free on fixed-route service for both the patron and a companion, if necessary.
- NOTE 6: The difference between Disabled half fares and METROLift fares is that Disabled half fares are intended for those patrons whose condition does not qualify them for METROLift. Only METROLift participants are eligible for the Freedom Passport.
- NOTE 7: Base fares increase in \$.50 increments for each progessively higher fare level.



MOVE Gainsharing Plan

I. GENERAL DESCRIPTION

METRO'S Making Opportunity for Value Enhancement (MOVE) Gainsharing Plan is a program whereby salaried and non-represented hourly employees are given a financial incentive to find new ways to save operating costs through improved work processes and fiscal and operational management. Savings in dollar terms will be determined for a given fiscal year and defined as a gain to be shared between the agency and the employees whose efforts brought about the savings.

The plan is being introduced as of January 1, 1995 with the initial performance period for payout purposes being measured from October 1, 1994 to September 30, 1995. If the program reaches its goals, the first payout from the MOVE Gainsharing Plan will be made in December 1995. In Fiscal Year 1996 and subsequent years, performance will be measured on a fiscal year basis, from October 1 to September 30.

II. ELIGIBILITY

All regular, permanent salaried and non-represented hourly employees who have been employed at least six (6) months and who are on the payroll as of September 30 of each fiscal year are eligible to participate in the MOVE Gainshare Plan.

Payouts for new employees with more than six (6) months employment will be prorated based on the length of employment.

Employees who leave METRO employment before September 30 of a fiscal year will not receive a payout. Eligible employees (or their beneficiary) who separate because of death, disability or retirement will be eligible for a prorated MOVE Gainshare payout.

III. BASIS OF DETERMINATION OF GAIN AND DISTRIBUTION

Payout from the plan will be determined by METRO's overall performance relative to predetermined cost and performance objectives each fiscal year. In Fiscal Year 1995, eligible employees will have the opportunity to earn a payout based on METRO's performance for the period from October 1, 1994 to September 30, 1995.

MOVE is a group incentive plan that rewards all eligible participants equally for their collective efforts. Payouts as a flat dollar amount will be the same for all employees.

Payout will be made if total expenses at the end of a fiscal year are less than budgeted Total Operating Expenses, excluding contingency. Fifty percent (50%) of the savings will be shared with eligible employees and fifty percent (50%) will remain in the METRO budget. Of the half that is distributed to eligible employees, forty percent (40%) will be distributed directly on a per capita basis. The remaining sixty percent (60%) of the budget savings will be distributed, also on a per capita basis, based on the achievement of ridership goals.

If cost savings below budgeted Total Operating Expenses are not achieved there will be no plan payout. There is no maximum payout from the plan.

IV. PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT

The following measurements will be used to determine plan performance and payout levels for Fiscal Year 1995.

1. <u>Total Operating Expenses (TOE)</u>

Total Operating Expenses (TOE) for plan purposes are defined as the sum of the total Operating Budget, excluding contingency, and Salaries and Administrative Expenses that are capitalized in the Capital Budget. For FY1995 this total is \$232,681,496.

2. Ridership

Threshold - 59,645,000 passenger trips. Total Ridership below this level will not earn a payout of the ridership portion of the plan.

Target - 60,267,000 passenger trips. Ridership at this level will earn 100% payout of the ridership portion of the plan.

Ridership between the threshold and target level will be paid on a sliding scale of 0% to 100%. Payment will be capped at 100% of the Fiscal Year ridership target.

For subsequent Fiscal Years new TOE, ridership objectives or other performance measures will be established. This performance objective process will continue each year that the MOVE Gainshare Plan is in effect.

V. <u>DISPOSITION OF UNDISTRIBUTED GAINS</u>

In the event that ridership goals are not attained and a full distribution of the sixty percent (60%) ridership portion is not made, those funds shall remain with the agency and will <u>not</u> be carried forward to be made eligible for future distribution.

VI. PAYMENTS

If plan cost savings are achieved, payments will be made by December following the end of each Fiscal Year. Payments are taxable as ordinary income.

VII. <u>IMPACT ON BENEFITS</u>

MOVE Gainsharing awards will not affect other benefits such as pension plan, life insurance, sick pay or disability benefits; these plans are impacted by base salary only.

VIII. ADMINISTRATION

The Plan will be administered by the MOVE Gainsharing Task Force. The Task Force will report to METRO's General Manager through an Executive Steering Committee appointed by the General Manager.

The MOVE Gainshare Plan may be changed, modified or cancelled at anytime by METRO's General Manager or the Board of Directors.

WHEREAS, the nature and scope of METRO's activities have evolved over the years from serving purely as a provider of public mass transportation services to one in which METRO performs a more comprehensive role in managing and promoting regional mobility; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors is of the opinion that it is appropriate to clarify and concisely state METRO's mission as it currently exists;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY THAT:

Section 1. The Board hereby approves and adopts as a Mission Statement for the Metropolitan Transit Authority of Harris County, Texas the mission as set out on Attachment A hereto.

The Board hereby approves and adopts an amendment to the General Mobility Capital Improvement program for fiscal years 1995-2004 to reschedule \$585,000 of funding from Project No. G-61, Grand Parkway: IH-10 to US 290, to place those funds into fiscal year 1995 from fiscal year 2002 in order to complete preliminary engineering work on this project; adding a project for the reconstruction of Strey Lane from Memorial Drive to Taylorcrest at a total project cost of \$250,000 to be undertaken in fiscal year 1996-1997; and adding a new project to reconstruct Voss Road from the Katy Freeway to Westview at a project cost of \$150,000 and to place this project in fiscal year 1995.

Section 2. This resolution is effective immediately upon passage.
