

RESOLUTION NO. 83- 40

ADOPTING A REGIONAL TRANSIT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR METRO'S MASS TRANSIT SYSTEM; PROVIDING FOR ADJUSTMENTS TO SUCH PROGRAM TO MEET THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE SYSTEM; AND MAKING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATIVE THERETO.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 1118x, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes, as amended, the Metropolitan Transit Authority of Harris County, Texas ("METRO") is empowered to develop a mass transit system (the "System") to serve its territory;

WHEREAS, the Board of METRO has established certain goals and objectives in developing the System, all of which seek to maintain or improve regional mobility while accommodating growth;

WHEREAS, such goals and objectives include the expansion and improvement of bus service within the territory of METRO; the construction of new bus facilities, consisting of maintenance facilities, park and ride facilities, transit shelters, community-based transit centers and busways; and the development of safe, efficient high-capacity rapid transit facilities in the major travel corridors within the territory of METRO; and

WHEREAS, the METRO staff and consultants have prepared and presented to the Board a recommended Regional Transit Capital Improvement Program (1983-1990) (the "Program") for development of portions of the System, which consists of certain bus, rail and related improvements and is categorized in three major elements: a service/fleet expansion program; a bus capital program; and a regional rail system program, all of which are more fully described in Exhibit A hereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT
AUTHORITY OF HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. The Program and its elements, as described in Exhibit A
hereto, are hereby adopted.


Section 2. In the future, the Board may adjust the Program and its





NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY THAT:







RESOLUTION NO. 83-42

CALLING A BOND ELECTION; MAKING PROVISIONS FOR
THE HOLDING AND CONDUCT THEREOF; AND CONTAINING
OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE SUBJECT

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transit Authority of Harris County, Texas (the "Authority") was created pursuant to Chapter 141, Acts of the 63rd Legislature of the State of Texas, Regular Session, 1973 (Article 1118x, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes, as amended) (the "Authority Act"), and was confirmed at a confirmation and tax election held on August 12, 1978, in accordance with the Authority Act;

WHEREAS, the Authority has, among others, the power to acquire, construct, complete, develop, own, operate and maintain a mass transit system or systems, as defined in the Authority Act, and further to issue bonds and notes, from time to time and in such amounts as it shall consider necessary or appropriate, for the acquisition, purchase, construction, reconstruction, repair, equipping, improvement or extension of such rapid transit system or systems and all properties thereof whether real, personal or mixed;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Authority Act the Authority may not issue bonds, except refunding bonds, payable wholly or partially from taxes, including its local sales and use tax, until such bonds are authorized by a majority vote of the qualified voters of the Authority voting in an election called and held for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is necessary and appropriate to call and hold an election for authorizing issuance of bonds payable wholly or partially from the Authority's local sales and use tax;

IT IS, THEREFORE, RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY OF HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. Findings. All the matters and facts set forth in the preamble of this Resolution are hereby found and determined to be true and correct.

Section 2. Call of Election; Date; Eligible Voters; and Hours. An election (the "Bond Election") shall be held on Saturday, June 11, 1983, in and throughout the territory of the Authority, at which all qualified voters of the Authority shall be permitted to vote. The hours during which the voting places are to be open at the Bond Election shall be from 7:00 o'clock a.m. to 7:00 o'clock p.m.

Section 3. Voting Precincts; Voting or Polling Places. Except as otherwise provided herein, the voting precincts and the voting or polling places for each such precinct are hereby established and designated to be certain of the regular county voting precincts and voting or polling places designated and established by the Commissioners' Courts of Harris County, Fort Bend County, Montgomery County and Waller County pursuant to the Texas Election Code, as amended (the "Election Code"), as such designations and establishments are reflected in the minutes of such Commissioners' Courts, all as set out in Exhibit A hereto, which is incorporated herein by reference for all purposes. In the event that he shall from time to time determine that one or more of the voting or polling places established and designated herein shall become unavailable or unsuitable for such use, the General Manager of the Authority (the "General Manager") is hereby authorized to designate in

writing substitute voting or polling place or places, giving such notice as he deems sufficient.

Section 4. Proposition. At the Bond Election there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the Authority the following proposition (the "Proposition"):

PROPOSITION

SHALL THE BOARD OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY OF HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS (THE "AUTHORITY") BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO BILLION THREE HUNDRED FIFTY MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,350,000,000), IN SUCH MANNER AND WITH SUCH TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS THE BOARD MAY DETERMINE, PAYABLE WHOLLY OR PARTIALLY FROM THE AUTHORITY'S LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX, TOGETHER WITH ALL OR ANY PORTION OF THE OTHER REVENUES OF THE AUTHORITY AS THE BOARD MAY DETERMINE, FOR THE ACQUISITION, PURCHASE, CONSTRUCTION, RECONSTRUCTION, REPAIR, EQUIPPING, IMPROVEMENT OR EXTENSION OF THE AUTHORITY'S RAPID TRANSIT SYSTEM OR SYSTEMS AND ALL PROPERTIES THEREOF, WHETHER REAL, PERSONAL OR MIXED, CONSISTING OF CERTAIN BUS, RAIL AND RELATED IMPROVEMENTS, ALL AS AUTHORIZED BY THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, INCLUDING PARTICULARLY (BUT NOT BY WAY OF LIMITATION) CHAPTER 141, ACTS OF THE 63RD LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, REGULAR SESSION, 1973 (ARTICLE 1118x, VERNON'S TEXAS CIVIL STATUTES), TOGETHER WITH ALL AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS THERETO?

Section 5. Ballots. The ballots shall conform to the requirements of the Election Code and shall have written or printed thereon the following:

OFFICIAL BALLOT

Section 6. Voting. Voting in the Bond Election shall be by electronic voting system in voting precincts designated "H" in Exhibit A hereto and by paper ballots in voting precincts designated "FB" in Exhibit A hereto. Each voter voting by electronic voting system and desiring to vote in favor of the Proposition shall punch the hole indicating "FOR" the Proposition, and each voter desiring to vote against the Proposition shall punch the hole indicating "AGAINST" the Proposition. Each voter voting by paper ballot shall vote on the Proposition by placing an "X" or other clear mark in the square beside the statement indicating the way such voter wishes to vote on the Proposition. Voting by either method shall be in accordance with the Election Code.

Section 6. Absentee Voting. Absentee voting shall be conducted during the period May 23 through June 7, 1983, excluding therefrom May 28, 29 and 30 in Harris County, and May 28, 29 and 30 and June 5 in Fort Bend County.

Absentee voting within Harris, Montgomery and Waller Counties shall be conducted by the County Clerk of Harris County, Texas, namely Anita Rodeheaver, using an electronic voting system in accordance with the Election Code. The place at which the absentee voting shall be conducted is designated as 409 San Jacinto Street at Commerce Avenue, Houston, Texas 77251, and the mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent is as follows: County Clerk of Harris County, P.O. Box 1525, Houston, Texas 77251. Absentee voting in Fort Bend County shall be conducted by the County Clerk of Fort Bend, Texas, namely Dianne Wilson, using paper ballots in accordance with the Election Code. The place at which the absentee voting shall be conducted is designated as Missouri City Hall, 310 Orchard, Missouri City, Texas, and the mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent is as follows: County Clerk of Fort Bend County, P.O. Box 520, Richmond, Texas 77469.

Such county clerks shall keep their offices open for at least eight (8) hours, expressly 8:00 o'clock a.m. to 4:30 o'clock p.m., each day, Monday through Friday, and for at least three (3) hours, expressly 2:00 o'clock p.m. to 5:00 o'clock p.m., each Saturday and Sunday as set forth herein, for absentee voting (except for Sunday, June 5 in Fort Bend County); provided, however, that except as authorized by Article 5.05, Subdivision 3d, Election Code, each clerk shall not permit anyone to vote absentee by personal appearance on any day which is not a regular working day for such clerk's office, and under no circumstances shall either clerk permit anyone to vote

absentee by personal appearance at any time when such clerk's office is not open to the public.

A special canvassing board to count and make return of absentee ballots in accordance with the Election Code is hereby established for Harris County (including Montgomery and Waller Counties) and Fort Bend County as follows:

Each respective presiding judge shall appoint two election clerks, and such judge and clerks shall constitute the special canvassing board and shall perform the duties set forth for such board in the Election Code.

Section 7. Conduct of Election; Pay of Election Officers. The Bond Election shall be conducted in each precinct by election officers, including a presiding judge, an alternate presiding judge and clerks, in accordance with the Authority Act, the Election Code, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America. The names of such judges are set out in Exhibit A opposite the voting precincts in which they will conduct the Bond Election. Each respective presiding judge shall appoint two clerks for the conduct of the election in each precinct; provided, however, that the General Manager shall have the authority to increase the maximum number of clerks for particular precincts where he deems it reasonable and necessary for the proper conduct of the Bond Election in such precinct. In the event that he shall from time to time determine that one or more of the presiding judges or alternate presiding judges so named shall become unavailable or disqualified, the General Manager is hereby authorized to designate and

appoint in writing a replacement judge or judges, giving such notice as he deems sufficient.

The pay for presiding judges, alternate presiding judges and clerks of the Bond Election shall be \$4.00 per hour for each judge and clerk, and the judge or election officers who deliver the returns of the election or the ballot container shall also be paid the amount of \$25 each, all in accordance with the Election Code.

Section 8. Delivery of Voted Ballots; Counting; Tabulation; Canvassing of Returns; Declaring Results. In voting precincts in which an electronic voting system is used, the election officers shall deliver the ballot containers to the central counting station. Tony Sirvello, III is hereby appointed as the Presiding Judge of the central counting station. After the completion of his responsibilities under the Election Code, including the counting of the voted ballots and the tabulation of the results, such judge shall make a written return of the election results to the Authority in accordance with the Election Code. In voting precincts in which paper ballots are used, the election officers shall return the results to the Authority in accordance with the Election Code. The Board shall canvass the returns and declare the results of the Bond Election. If a majority of the qualified voters of the Authority voting in the Bond Election, including absentee voting, shall vote in favor of the Proposition, the Board shall be authorized to issue the bonds described therein.

Section 9. Training of Election Officers. Pursuant to the Election Code, a public school of instruction for all election officers shall be held at 7:00 o'clock p.m. on June 7, 1983, as follows:

Section 10. Notice of Bond Election. Notice of the Bond Election, stating in substance the contents of this Resolution, shall be published in the English and in the Spanish language once a week for three consecutive weeks, with the first publication in a newspaper with general circulation in the Authority at least 21 days before the Bond Election.

Section 11. Notice of Meeting. The Board officially finds, determines, recites and declares that written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted was posted on a bulletin board located at a place convenient to the public at the administrative office of the Authority for at least 72 hours preceding the scheduled time of the meeting; that a copy of such written notice was furnished to the Harris County Clerk of Harris County, Texas, in sufficient time for posting for a least 72 hours preceding the scheduled time of the meeting on a bulletin board located at a place convenient to the public in the Harris County Courthouse; that a copy of such written notice was posted on a bulletin board located in the

Harris County Courthouse for the time required by law preceding this meeting, all as required by Article 6252-17, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes, as amended; and that such meeting was open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Resolution and the subject matter thereof was discussed, considered and formally acted upon.

Section 12. Authority of the General Manager. The General Manager shall have the authority to take, or cause to be taken, all actions reasonable and necessary to insure that the Bond Election is fairly held and returns properly counted and tabulated for canvass by the Board, which actions are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 13. Authorization to Execute. The Chairman of the Board is authorized to execute and the Secretary of the Board is authorized to attest this Resolution on behalf of the Board; and the Chairman of the Board is authorized to do all other things legal and necessary in connection with the holding and consummation of the Bond Election.

Section 14. Effective Date. This Resolution is effective immediately upon its passage and approval.





EXHIBIT A
to
Resolution 83-42

A. Except as provided in Paragraph B hereof, the Board hereby designates and constitutes METRO Voting Precincts as follows:

(1) Each Harris County, Fort Bend County, Montgomery County or Waller County Voting Precinct which lies wholly within the territory of the Authority shall constitute a METRO Voting Precinct with the same number and boundaries as established by the appropriate order of the Commissioner's Court of each respective County, to all such orders reference is hereby made for all purposes, and

(2) Each portion of each Harris County, Fort Bend County, Montgomery County or Waller County Voting Precinct which lies partly within and partly without the territory of the Authority shall constitute a METRO Voting Precinct with the same number and boundaries (expressly excluding and limiting thereby that portion of such precinct not within the territory of the Authority) as established by the appropriate order of the Commissioner's Court of each respective county, to all such order reference is hereby made for all purposes.

B. The Board hereby designates and constitutes METRO Voting Precincts as follows:

(1) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-66 shall consist of Harris County Voting Precinct No. 66 and those portions of Harris County Voting Precinct Nos. 81, 190, 208, 527, 561, 562, 563 and 564 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(2) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-83 shall consist of those portions of Harris County Voting Precinct Nos. 83 and 363 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(3) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-98 shall consist of those portions of Harris County Voting Precinct Nos. 98, 97, 380 and 382 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(4) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-119 shall consist of Harris County Voting Precinct No. 119, and that portion of Waller County Voting Precinct No. 6 that lies solely within the city limits of the City of Katy.

(5) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-162 shall consist of those portions of Harris County Precinct Nos. 162 and 163 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(6) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-199 shall consist of Harris County Voting Precinct No. 199 and that portion of Montgomery County Voting Precinct No. 14 that lies solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(7) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-266 shall consist of Harris County Voting Precinct No. 266 and that portion of Harris County Voting Precinct No. 150 that lies solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(8) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-369 shall consist of Harris County Voting Precinct Nos. 369 and 368.

(9) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-371 shall consist of those portions of Harris County Voting Precinct Nos. 371 and 45 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(10) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-475 shall consist of those portions of Harris County Voting Precinct Nos. 475 and 474 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(11) METRO Voting Precinct No. H-535 shall consist of those portions of Harris County Voting Precinct Nos. 535 and 91 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(12) METRO Voting Precinct No. FB-013 shall consist of Fort Bend Voting Precinct No. 013 and 050 that lie solely within the city limits of Missouri City.

(13) METRO Voting Precinct No. FB-030 shall consist of Fort Bend County Voting Precinct Nos. 030, 033 and those portions of Fort Bend County Voting Precinct Nos. 011, 034 and 035 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Missouri City or City of Houston.

(14) METRO Voting Precinct No. FB-031 shall consist of Fort Bend County Voting Precinct No. 031 and 017 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

(15) METRO Voting Precinct No. FB-049 shall consist of Fort Bend Voting Precinct Nos. 049, 028 and those portions of Fort Bend Voting Precinct Nos. 047 and 048 that lie solely within the city limits of Missouri City.

(16) METRO Voting Precinct No. FB-051 shall consist of Fort Bend County Voting Precinct Nos. 051 and 052 that lie solely within the city limits of the City of Houston.

SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 83-42
REGARDING CALLING A BOND ELECTION;
MAKING PROVISIONS FOR THE HOLDING AND CONDUCT THEREOF;

WHEREAS, on May 5, 1983, the Board of the Metropolitan Transit Authority of Harris County, Texas (the "Authority") passed and approved Resolution No. 83-42 (the "Election Resolution"); and

Section 1. The Election Resolution is amended as follows:

- A. Voting in the Bond Election shall be by electronic voting system in all precincts in accordance with the Election Code. In voting precincts designated "H" in Exhibit A hereto ballot cards shall be used, and in voting precincts designated "FB" in Exhibit A hereto paper ballots shall be used. Each voter voting by use of a ballot card and desiring to vote in favor of the Proposition shall punch the hole indicating "FOR" the Proposition, and each such voter desiring to vote against the Proposition shall punch the hole indicating "AGAINST" the Proposition. Each voter voting by use of a paper ballot shall vote on the Proposition by placing an "X" or other clear mark in the square beside the statement indicating the way such voter wishes to vote on the Proposition.

- B. The place at which absentee voting shall be conducted in Harris, Montgomery and Waller Counties is designated as 49 San Jacinto Street at Commerce Avenue, Houston, Texas. Absentee voting in Fort Bend County shall be by use of an electronic voting system in accordance with the Election Code.
- C. The Harris County Clerk shall keep her office open from 2:00 o'clock p.m. to 8:00 o'clock p.m. each Saturday and Sunday as set forth herein, for absentee voting.
- D. The offices of Presiding Judge for the special canvassing board to count and make return of absentee ballots in Harris County and Fort Bend County are replaced with the offices of Chairman of the Canvassing Board for Absentee Voting, and John J. Douglass is hereby appointed as such Chairman for Harris County and Dianne Wilson is hereby appointed as such Chairman for Fort Bend County. The Harris County Chairman shall appoint four, rather than two, election clerks.
- E. The maximum number of clerks is increased to more than two for certain voting precincts as designated in Exhibit A attached hereto.
- F. For voting precincts designated "H" in Exhibit A hereto, Anita Rodeheaver is hereby appointed as the Presiding Judge of the central counting station; Tony Sirvello, III is hereby appointed as the Manager of the central counting station; and Guadalupe Loera, Jr. is hereby appointed as the Tabulation Supervisor. For voting precincts designated "FB" in Exhibit A hereto, Dianne Wilson is hereby ap-

pointed as the Presiding Judge of the central counting station; Shirley Davis is hereby appointed as the Manager of the central counting station; and Jan Easley is hereby appointed as the Tabulation Supervisor. Each such election officer shall perform the duties for his or her respective office as set forth in the Election Code.

G. Exhibit A to the Election Resolution is revised as attached hereto.

Section 2. Except as amended herein, the Election Resolution remains in full force and effect.

Section 3. All actions taken or to be taken by the General Manager pursuant to or consistent with the Election Resolution or this Resolution are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. A RESOLUTION

CLARIFYING THE REGIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM WITH REGARD TO THE SELECTION OF THE ALIGNMENT OF THE SOUTHEAST RAIL FACILITY AND THE TIMING OF COMMENCEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION AND THE EXTENSION OF SUCH FACILITY.

WHEREAS, on May 5, 1983, the Board of Directors of METRO ("Board") approved and adopted METRO's Regional Transit Capital Improvement Program: 1983-1990 ("Capital Program");

WHEREAS, the Capital Program included a map entitled "1990 Rail Capital Program" which reflected that the Southeast rail facility would be located on the existing Mykawa rail right-of-way, and, further, that such facility would be under construction along the entirety of such alignment to its intersection with the southern boundary of Harris County in the year 1990;

WHEREAS, the text of the Capital Program includes on page 4 a statement that rail service will be extended to the Southeast "[f]ollowing completion of the Stage One facility";

WHEREAS, the Board desires to clarify its intent that the alignment of the Southeast rail facility will be selected only after completion of required studies and after the Board secures formal input from a representative group of citizens who reside in the Southeast corridor as to a proper selection of alternative alignments, specifically including the proposed route along Martin Luther King Boulevard;

WHEREAS, the Board further desires to clarify its intent that the design and commencement of construction of the Southeast

rail facility will be undertaken before actual completion of the Stage One Crosstimbers to West Belt facility; and

WHEREAS, the Board further desires to clarify its intent that extensions of the Southeast rail facility beyond the South Loop - Bellfort area, either to Hobby Airport or south along Mykawa or Martin Luther King Boulevard, will be considered on a par with other Stage Two, Phase B projects described on page 4 of the Capital Program, specifically including the proposed North extension, for which the METRO staff has already undertaken Phase I Alternatives Analysis, published corridor refinement studies and been authorized to proceed with Phase II Alternatives Analysis by Board Resolution dated March 23, 1983;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY THAT:

Section 1. It is the intention of the Board to construct a rail facility in the Southeast corridor extending from the downtown area to the vicinity of the South Loop/Bellfort as a part of Stage One after economic commitments to the heavy rail project from Crosstimbers to West Belt have been met. The precise route and the technology selected for the Southeast rail project will be determined after a formal process of input from a representative group of citizens who reside in the Southeast corridor has been completed and after completion of required alternative analyses and environmental impact studies. Extensions of the Southeast rail project will be considered by the Board on a par


with its consideration of all proposed Stage Two, Phase B extensions: Crosstimbers to North Belt with a connection to Intercontinental Airport; West Loop through Post Oak to South Rice Stage One rail station; West from downtown parallel to Katy Freeway to Highway 6; and a connection from Stage One to Texas Medical Center. The Board's consideration of these various proposed extensions will be based on potential ridership, economic feasibility, environmental impacts and other relevant factors.




